

George Rosenthal dec'd Upon the petition of John Baker surviving administrator of George Rosenthal late of Hempfield Township Westmoreland County dec'd setting forth that the personal estate of said decedent is insufficient for the payment of his just debts as will appear by the schedule hereunto annexed - and at the time of his decease, said George was seized & possessed of a tract of land in said Township adjoining Philip Fox Andrew Rosenthal and Isaac Shinn containing twenty eight acres or thereabouts - and praying the Court to grant him an order to sell said land for the purpose of paying the just debts of the said George Rosenthal dec'd &c.

Whereupon the Court in due consideration had of the premises doth advise the said John Baker surviving administrator of the said George Rosenthal dec'd to sell the said tract of land with the appurtenances on the premises on the first Monday (7<sup>th</sup> day) of April next to the highest and best bidder - Notices whereof to be made out and set up according to the act of assembly - and also to be published in one of the Greensburgh Newspapers for three successive weeks before such sale - and that he make report of his proceedings herein to the next orphans Court to be held for the said County of Westmoreland after such sale - March 1<sup>st</sup> 1834 copy of order of sale and six notices - spread - May 19<sup>th</sup> 1834 Report filed in the orphans Court to wit: "To the Honorable orphans Court of Westmoreland County: The undersigned respects makes Report, that in pursuance of the foregoing authority he did expose to sale at public vendue on the premises the real estate therein described on the first Monday of April 1834 after having given due public and timely notice thereof according to the act of assembly and sold the same to Andrew Rosenthal for the sum of one hundred and seventy seven dollars, he being the highest and best bidder and that the highest and best bid was given for the same - which sale he trusts may be confirmed." John Baker" Which Report being read and heard, was on motion of S. G. Barclay Esquire, Confirmed and approved by the Court.
