Know all Men by these Presents, That we, George N. Johnston;
Anthony J. Kleitz, and Richard P. Flynn
of Allegheny County, Pennsylvania, are held and firmly bound unto the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in the sum of Three hundred thirty (\$330.00) dollars, to be paid to the said Commonwealth, to which payment, well and truly to be made, we do bind ourselves, jointly and severally, for and in the whole, our heirs, executors and administrators, and each and every of them, firmly by these presents. Sealed with our seals and dated the 26th day of August, A. D. one thousand nine hundred and four.

The Condition of this Obligation is, That if the above bounden George N. Johnston
administrator of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of Wass P. Johnston
deceased, do make, or cause to be made, a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of said deceased, which have come or shall come to the hands, possession or knowledge of the said administrator or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for said administrator and the same, so made, do exhibit, or cause to be exhibited, into the Register's Office, in the County of Allegheny, within thirty days from the date hereof; and the same goods, chattels and credits, and all other the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased at the time of decedent's death, which at any time after shall come to the hands or possession of the said administrator, or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for said administrator, do well and truly administer according to law; and further, do make, or cause to be made, a just and true account of said administration, in one year from the date hereof, or when thereunto legally required, and all the rest and residue of the said goods, chattels and credits, which shall be found remaining upon the said administrator's account, the same being first examined and allowed by the Orphans' Court of Allegheny County, shall deliver and pay unto such person or persons as the said Orphans' Court, by their decree or sentence pursuant to law, shall limit and appoint, and shall well and truly comply with the laws of this Commonwealth relating to collateral inheritances; and if it shall hereafter appear that any last Will and Testament was made by the said deceased, and the same shall be proved according to law, if the said administrator being thereunto required, do surrender the said letters of administration into the Register's Office aforesaid, then this obligation to be void, otherwise to remain in full force.
