

## **Mrs. R. A. Nabours, 83, Passes Away Here Sunday**

**Mrs. R. A. Nabours, 83, a pioneer citizen of Milam County, passed away at the Cameron Hospital, Sunday, November 7. Since the death of her husband in 1927, she had made her home with her daughter, Mrs. John House.**

**Funeral services were conducted from the Salem Methodist church, Monday afternoon at 4 o'clock. The Rev. Bob L. Pool, pastor of the Methodist church here, assisted by Rev. H. M. Bailey, Maysfield, officiated. Interment was made in the Salem cemetery. Pallbearers were Charlie Gibb, and Bob Terry, Jerry and Jay Nabours, and Goodhue Rogers. These same men were pallbearers at Mr. Nabours' funeral 16 years ago.**

**Mrs. Nabours, the former Rebecca Poteet, was born in Mississippi, Aug. 15, 1860. She came to Texas with her family during 1870 and settled in the Salem community where she was married to R. A. Nabours in 1878. She was a lifelong member of the Methodist church.**

**Survivors are the daughters: Mrs. John House of this city, Mrs. H. W. Massengale of Maysfield, Mrs. C. M. Davis of Forth Worth; and two sons, W. H. Nabours of Oklahoma City, and County Clerk Homer Nabours of this city. Sixteen grandchildren arrived, three of whom are in the Armed Forces. Bob H. Nabours, son of Mr. And Mrs. Homer Nabours is in the Canadian army, and Herbert and Robert Massengale, sons of Mrs. H. W. Massengale of Maysfield are in the U. S. army.**
